This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students achieving C standard or higher in English, Math and Science to >85% in Year 1 to 6.
- Increase the percentage of NCCD students achieving a C standard or higher in English.
- Increase the percentage of students achieving in Upper Two Bands in Reading and Numeracy to 30% for Year 3 and 30% for Year 5.
- Increase levels of student engagement measured through reduction in behaviour incidents and increased attendance percentages.

- Develop data literacy capability to analyse data and engage in data conversations to track
- and monitor student learning and engagement through cohort meetings and staff meetings
- Develop and implement a clear and consistent Case Management process
- Review and implement the Student Code of Conduct and develop an action plan for the implementation of Positive Behaviour for Learning
